
This team may consist of:

Getting Ready for Kindergarten





Build your child's independence by encouraging them to:





- Dress themselves (zippers, buttons)
- Use the bathroom and wash their hands on their own
- Put away toys and help around the home
- Practice opening and closing snack containers and using a water bottle
- Play games, take turns and compromise
- Develop a consistent bedtime routine



Getting Ready for Kindergarten









Take time to talk and read with your child about everyday!

- Share special activities together, such as walks to the park
- Talk about what you are seeing and doing
- Praise children for their efforts and courage to overcome setbacks
- Talk about how it is okay to make mistakes
- Visit your community library (when possible)
- Encourage your child to talk about the pictures and stories as you read together

We are always looking for volunteers


- Current police clearance is required
- Annual authorization forms are required (annually!)
- Must have been an Alberta Resident for a minimum of 1 year (to receive police clearance)

Process:

- Share ID with office/admin personnel
- Complete annual authorization form
- Receive CBE letter
- Complete application, and submit payment, online
- Receive clearance letter from CPS or RCMP
- Share letter with office/admin personnel
