



WHAT IS A SOCIAL WORKER?

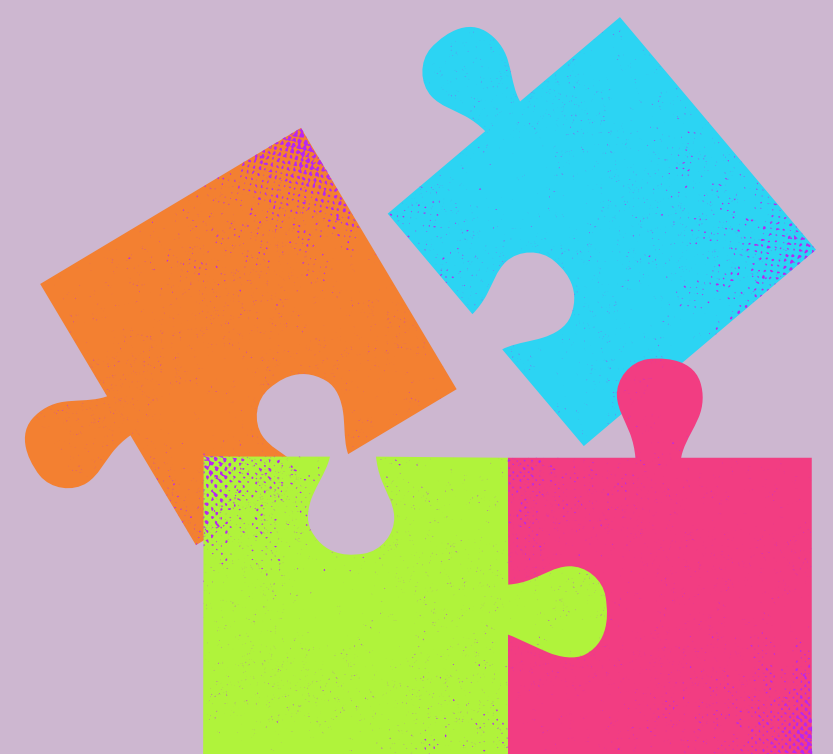
A social worker is someone who is professionally trained to work with individuals, families, and communities. Their goal generally is to, enhance their clients well-being, and provide support.

- advocate/help children advocate for needs in the classroom and at home



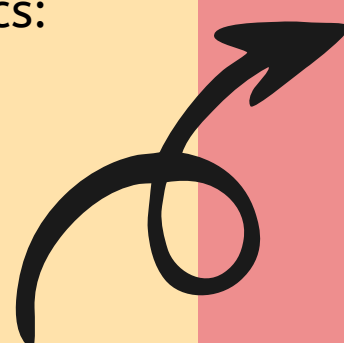

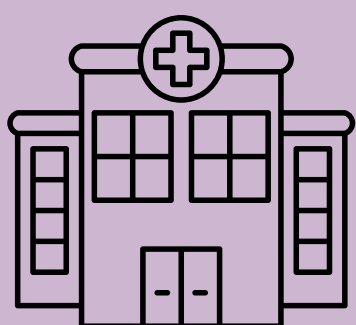

Everyone we work with!

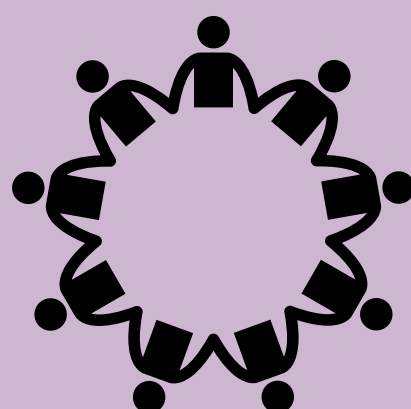
Teachers, staff administrators, students, parents, guardians, people in the community, other agencies, etc.

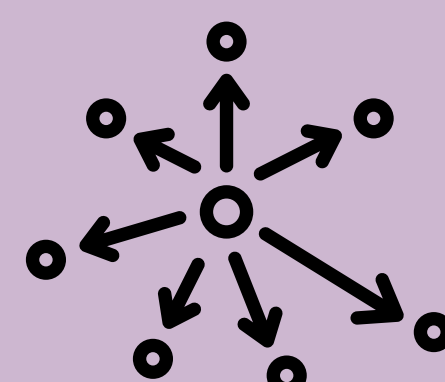
